#### **Elder Leadership Defined**

"God entrusts the oversight of His church to a plurality of called, examined, qualified, accountable men who are duty-bound to provide care, direction-setting, and decision-making for the Body."

A pivotal question is: According to the Bible, whom will God hold accountable for the leadership of the church?

#### Things that confuse the issue:

- We live in the United States in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century.
- We often idolize and criminalize leaders.
- Many churches confuse the work of Deacons and Elders
- Many often defer to traditions without a careful look at the Bible.

# Elders serve the church in \_\_\_\_\_-filled and \_\_\_\_\_-guided leadership.

- Biblical church leadership is not accomplished through secret hallway conversations, being the most persistent complainer, or popularity contests.
- Acts 6:1-4 "...give our attention to prayer and the ministry of the word."
- Acts 20:28; 1 Peter 5:1-3
- "Elders lead the church [1 Tim 5:17; Titus 1:7; 1 Peter 5:1-2], teach and preach the Word [1 Timothy 3:2; 2 Timothy 4:2; Titus 1:9], protect the church from false teachers [Acts 20:17, 28-31], exhort and admonish the

saints in sound doctrine [1 Timothy 4:13; 2 Timothy 3:13-17; Titus 1:9], visit the sick and pray [James 5:14; Acts 20:35], and judge doctrinal issues [Acts 15:16]. In biblical terminology, elders shepherd, oversee, lead, and care for the local church"—Alexander Strauch

- Though difficult and unpopular, submission is a gift of protection.
- 1 Thessalonians 5:12-13 "We ask you, brothers, to respect those who
  labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to
  esteem them very highly in love because of their work."
- Hebrews 13:7 "Remember your leaders (lit. those who rule over you)..."
- Hebrews 13:17 "Obey your leaders (*lit. those who rule over you*) and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you."
- Hebrews 13:24 "Greet all your leaders (lit. those who rule over you)..."
- 1 Peter 5:1-3 "shepherd the flock...exercising oversight"

What this does not mean	What this does mean
Elders are without sin.	Elders are sinful and fallen men. As such, elders must serve with humility recognizing their own frailty.
Elders are dictators.	Elders are called to serve the Bride of Christ. As such, elders should model loving, Christ-like, servant leadership.
Elders make unilateral decisions.	Elders are to recognize that each member is endowed with the Holy Spirit of God. As such, elders should seek the counsel of other mature Christians in the church.
